The nearly 3.8 million lbs of materials we recovered in 2023 resulted in the following impacts.



ENERGY IMPACT

35,536 GALLONS OF GASOLINE SAVED

Projects from 2023 saved the equivalent of taking 67 cars off the road for a year

315.8 MTCO2e SAVED (metric tons of carbon dioxide equivalent)

Projects in 2023 reduced greenhouse gas emissions equivalent to reducing the use of 13,159 cylinders of propane used for home barbecues



TEAM EXPANSION

In 2023 we focused our attention on growing our deconstruction crew. We hired a new estimator and operations manager, expanded our field crew to 10, and enhanced our team culture with monthly barbeques and more training resources. Under the leadership of Co-Owner Clemente Castanon, our dedicated and professional team completed 146 deconstruction and demolition projects ranging from selective interior projects to full house deconstructions.










RECLAIMED LUMBER WAREHOUSE GROWTH

In 2023, we reached new heights with our retail reclaimed building material operation: We created an online store that updates regularly with our always-changing reclaimed inventory, making it simple for customers to browse and shop online. We also hired a full-time Warehouse Coordinator who organizes, inventories, and sells materials, and who also accepts custom orders for handcrafted reclaimed wood products such as garden beds, shelves, and outdoor storage sheds. We've also embraced the "more" part of our tagline "Reclaimed lumber, flooring, and more!" with a sometimes vintage and eclectic array of items we salvage from jobsites, and have started offering more kitchen cabinet sets, lighting, and fixtures. Our intention is to provide reusable materials at a discounted rate so that DIYers get a deal and we keep valuable materials out of the landfill.











CHANGE MAKING & COMMUNITY BUILDING

Throughout 2023, Founder Anna Perks brought her expertise in deconstruction and sustainable resource management to various boards, events, organizations, and conferences. Anna has been an active member of the Denver Task Force that was created to help advise and revise the voter-passed ballot initiative "Waste No More," passed by voters in 2022. This has involved working with other stakeholders in the Colorado construction and waste/recycling hauling industries. In 2023, she was also an active member of the City of Boulder deconstruction working group, which was created to help enhance the deconstruction requirements. Anna is also an active member and now board member of the nonprofit Recycle Colorado, of which she helped develop a sustainable demolition toolkit for Colorado municipalities. In November 2023, Denver-based 5280 Magazine featured Perks Deconstruction in an article about Denver's "Waste No More" policy.

CELEBRATING 5 SUCCESSFUL YEARS IN BUSINESS


